PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED AT CONTESTED HEARINGS

In relation to applications for:

- (a) Premises Licences - new applications (s17), variations (s34 & s37) and transfers (s42)
- (b) Club Certificates - new applications (s72) and variations (s84)
- (c) Personal Licences - new applications and renewals (s117)
- (d) Counter Notices following a Temporary Event Notice (s104)

1. The Chairman will introduce himself, other members and officers.
2. The Chair will also ask the Applicant, Interested Persons and the Responsible Authorities to introduce themselves, and any witnesses they may wish to call.
3. The Chair/relevant officer will explain to the parties the procedure to be followed. (See points 4 - 10 inclusive)
4. The proceedings will commence with Licensing Officer outlining the reason(s) for the hearing, and stating whether any representations have been withdrawn.
5. The Applicant will be asked to present their case. The order for asking questions at the end of the Applicant's presentation will be:
 - Responsible Authorities;
 - Interested Parties;
 - Members of the Sub-Committee, either on their own behalf or through the Legal Adviser.
6. Where witnesses are called each witness will give their evidence and then be open to questioning in the order as above.
7. Other parties, i.e. Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties, if applicable, and in that order, will then be given an opportunity to present their representations.
8. Once the representations have been presented and any evidence given, there will be an opportunity for questions to be asked, by;
 - Responsible Authorities to each other (only exceptionally if needed for clarification);
 - Interested Parties;
 - The Applicant;
 - Members of the Sub-Committee, either on their own behalf or through the Legal Adviser;
9. Once all the evidence has been presented the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties, if applicable, will have the opportunity to sum up their objections in the same order as they presented their case. No new evidence may be presented at this point.
10. Finally the applicant(s) will sum up their case. Again no new evidence may be presented.

11. The Chair will enquire if all parties have said everything they wish to and ask if there are any legal matters that need to be clarified. The Sub-Committee will then withdraw to deliberate in private, and will be accompanied by the Legal Adviser. The decision shall be arrived at by the Sub-Committee alone.
12. In most cases the Sub-Committee will make its determination at the conclusion of the hearing, and the pronouncement of that determination shall be made in public. This will be subsequently notified in writing with reasons in accordance with the Regulations.
13. Where the Sub-Committee is not required to make its decision at the conclusion of the hearing, and it chooses not to do so, it will make its decision within 5 working days of the last day of the hearing, and will notify that decision without unreasonable delay.

NB: There are now only two instances where a decision is required at the conclusion of the hearing; firstly a counter notice in relation to a Temporary Event Notice (s105), and secondly a review following a closure order (s167). In all other cases the Sub-Committee has up to 5 working days to reach its decision, but for practical purposes it will generally be made immediately following the hearing.

Purpose Of Report

Members to consider evidence produced at a public hearing for variation of a premise licence application for Ego at Old Ashfields, Sutton Road, Kirkby-In-Ashfield, Nottinghamshire NG17 8HX and determine the application by taking such of the steps set out below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

Members must consider all evidence offered at the Hearing and make a unbiased decision on the evidence offered, the Home office guidance and the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy.

Detailed Information

The Licensing Act 2003 came in to force in September 2005.

It passed the powers to the Local Authority to licence premises for any of the following licensable activities :-

- A) The sale by retail of alcohol
- B) The supply of alcohol by or on behalf of a club or to the order of a member of the club
- C) The provision of regulated entertainment
- D) The provision of late night refreshment

The licensing objectives are:

The prevention of crime and disorder;
Public safety;
The prevention of public nuisance; and
The protection of children from harm.

Each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the promotion of the four objectives is a paramount consideration at all times.

However, the legislation also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work.

Section 18 of the 2003 Act, allows interested persons, and responsible authorities, to make representations in favour or against the grant or variation of a premises licence.

Should valid representations be received a public hearing must be held within 20 working days following the end of the representation period.

On the 17 October 2016, an application was received for a variation to the Premises Licence for Ego at Old Ashfields, Sutton Road, Kirkby-In-Ashfield, Nottinghamshire NG17 8HX. The application is attached within the hearing file, at Appendix A.

During the 28 day representation period the Licensing Team received nine valid representations against the application for variation of the premise licence from residents of Kirkby-In- Ashfield, and Sutton-In-Ashfield contained in the file attached.

Representations have been received from nine Interested Persons. No other representations, were received from other Responsible Authorities.

The current Premise Licence (number PR/05129v19) is attached at appendix B.

THE LICENSING ACT 2003
THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES

The Licensing Authority **MUST** carry out its function so as to promote the four Licensing Objectives, namely:-

1. The prevention of crime and disorder;
2. Public safety;
3. Prevention of public nuisance;
4. The protection of children from harm.

Each of the Licensing Objectives must be given equal weight, these objectives are:-

- a. The **ONLY** matters which are relevant to an application for a licence;
- b. The **ONLY** grounds upon which relevant representations to an application can be made;
- c. The **ONLY** grounds on which an application can be refused or on which conditions can be imposed on a licence.

OPTIONS

The Licensing Authority has the following options in cases where relevant representations have been made:-

- i. Grant the Licence subject to conditions that are consistent with the Operating Schedule;
- ii. Exclude from the Licence any of the Licensable activities to which the application relates;
- iii. Refuse to specify a person in the Licence as the Designated Premises Supervisor;
- iv. Grant the Licence subject to different conditions and/ or different licensable activities for different parts of the premises;
- v. Refused to Grant.

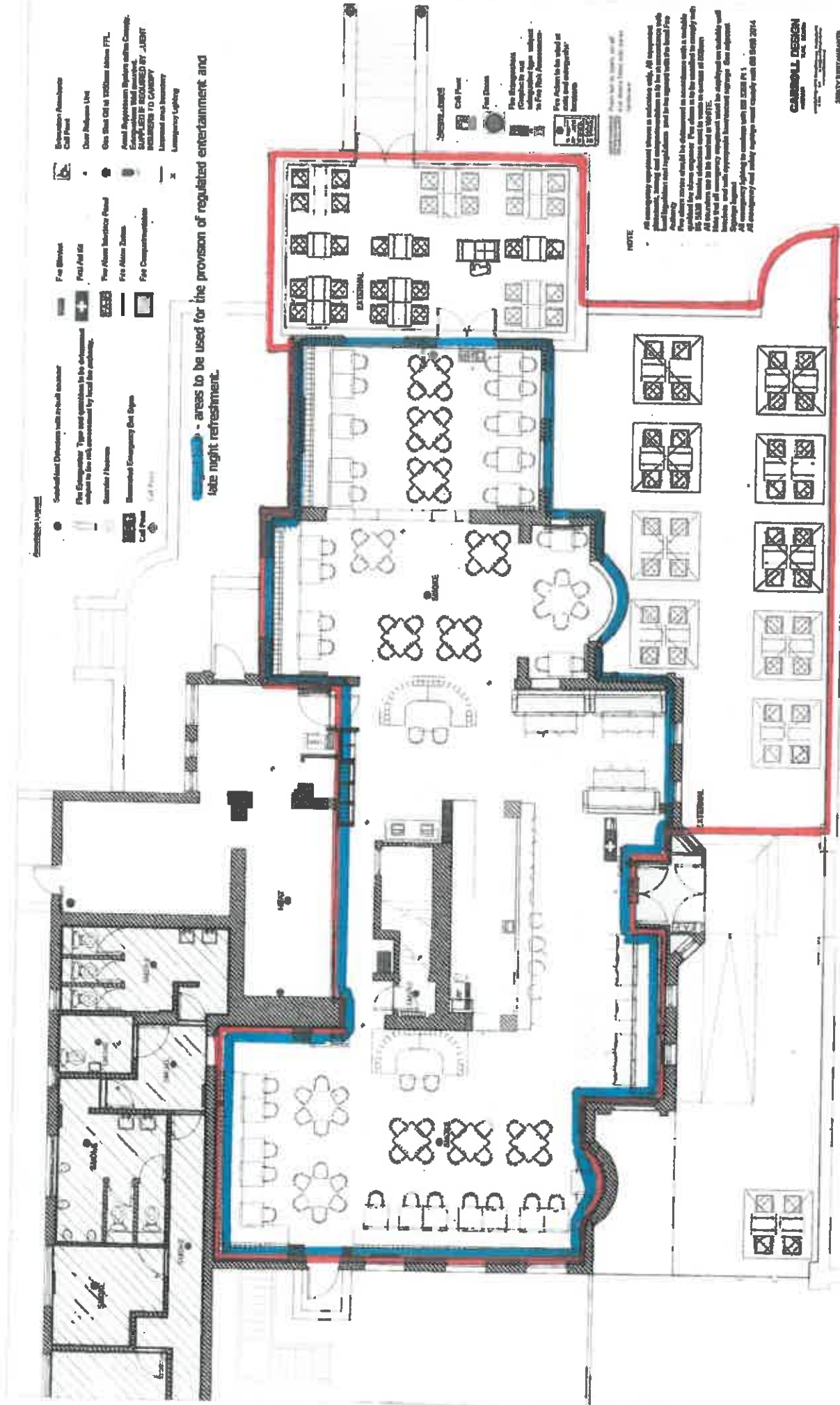

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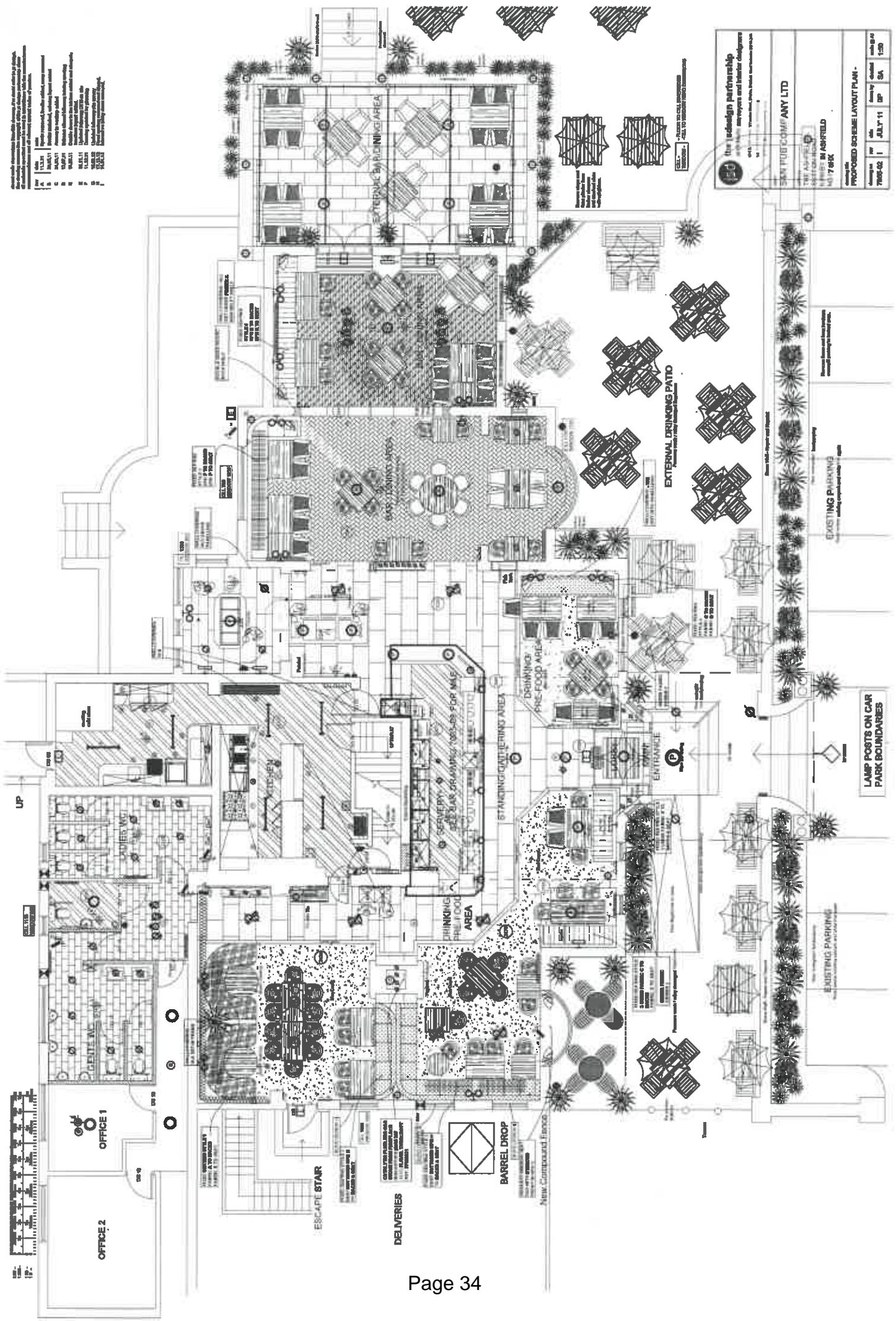

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by the sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which takes place before the expiry of the period 14 days beginning on the second day.

If the wording in the application was amended I would agree with an alternative extension to the licensing hours of the Property as follows: -

There should be no change to the current operating hours Sunday to Thursday (Closing at 23:30 hours). This is to minimise the impact on their neighbours who have routine weekday commitments such as schooling, employment etc.

The playing of music (live or recorded) should be allowed until 00.30am with venue closing at 01.00am on Friday and Saturday if the following statements are added to the license (These statements must apply to all music played at the venue, irrelevant of the day):

- All windows must be closed when music is being played.
- Both sets of main entrance doors must be closed (i.e. not wedged open) when music is being played (except for access/egress).
- All fire exits must be closed when music is being played (except for emergency egress).
- The external speakers currently erected to the front of the property must be removed as to ensure they are not accidentally activated.
- Glass bottles must not be placed in to the waste skips after 23:00pm or before 07:00am.

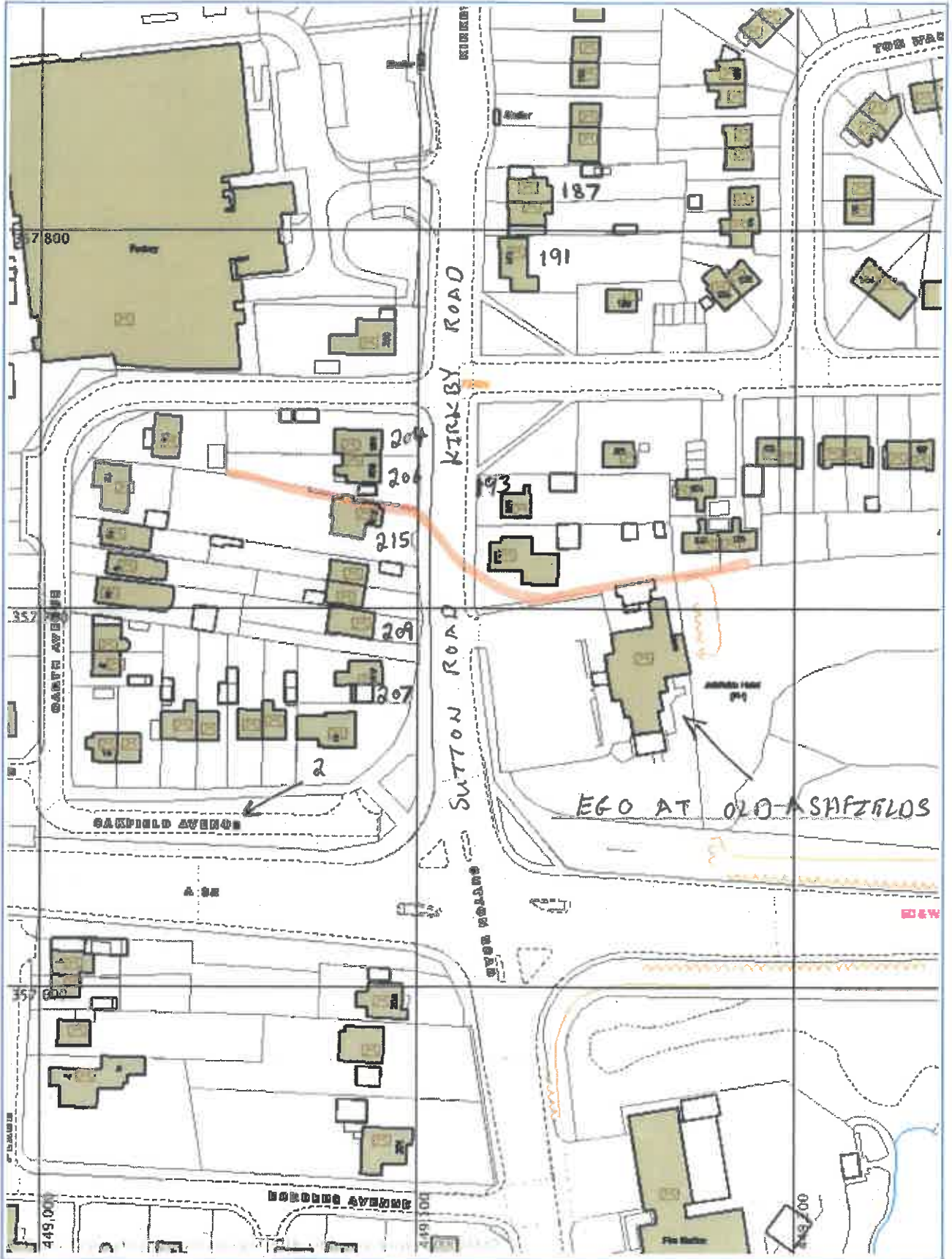
