<u>Palms Bistro 96 – 98 Victoria Road</u> Kirkby In Ashfield Notts NG17 8AS

- A CCTV system with recording equipment shall be installed and maintained at the premises. Cameras shall cover the entrance and exit to the premises and all areas where the sale/supply of alcohol takes place. Equipment shall be maintained in good working order and
 - Be of evidential quality and produce images in all lighting conditions;
 - Indicate the correct time and date;
 - Be retained for 31 days;
 - Sufficient staff will be trained to use the system;

The original images will be made available for inspection upon reasonable request to Officers of responsible authorities.

Copies of the recordings shall be provided in a format which can be viewed on readily available equipment without the need for specialist software.

- 2.) A bound and sequentially paginated refusals book or electronic record shall be kept at the premises to record all instances where admission or service is refused. Such records shall show:
 - The basis for the refusal;
 - The person making the decision to refuse; and
 - The date and time of the refusal.

Such records shall be retained at the Premises for at least 12 months, and shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Police or any other authorised person upon request.

- 3.) A bound and sequentially paginated incident/accident book shall be kept to record all instances of disorder, damage to property and personal injury at the premises. This book shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Police and other officers of Responsible Authorities immediately upon request, and all such books shall be retained at the premises for at least 12 months.
- 4.) All members of staff shall be fully trained in the retail sale of alcohol. The training shall be on-going and each member of staff shall be reviewed every six months. All details of the level of training will be recorded in a bound and sequentially paginated book or electronic record. This information shall be made available for inspection and copying by the Police or any other authorised person on request and all such books shall be retained at the premises for at least 12 months
- 5.) Challenge 25 notices will be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises.
- 6.) A Challenge 25 or similar policy will be implemented and enforced at all times. Any person who appears to be under 25 years of age shall not be allowed to purchase alcohol unless they produce an acceptable form of photo identification. (e.g. a passport or driving licence, Military ID or PASS accredited card.)
- 7.) Signage shall be displayed advising customers to be respectful to residents and to leave the area in a quiet and orderly manner.

The premises have an outside tabled forecourt where drinking on hot summer nights would be very disturbing. We do not know if the premises has a smoking area and if so it is to be hoped that they do not cross the road to smoke outside our house leaving nub ends along our pavement in front of our house???

My husband and son have to be up early in the mornings for work and we do not wish to be retiring to bed with the windows closed to help reduce the noise from shouting and car doors slamming. The premises would serve till 23.00 hours and they still would have to have time for customers to drink up.

WOULD YOU LIKE A LICENCED CAFÉ ACROSS FROM YOUR HOUSEIIII

You have to relise that there are elderly people too on this road that may not even be aware of these proposals that may not even get the chad!!! Have letters been sent out to them??

2ND CONCERN

Although this is not our main worry as above, we do worry about parking along the road

A lot of residents do not have a drive.....they encounter problems parking up not necessarily outside their homes but may have to park around the block/next street on

Yes, you may say that's ok but!!!! What if that person elderly, mothers with small children that have more of a chance of running in the road, people with heavy bags shopping to unload. Some people work shifts come home to shop early evening they come home car parked outside till closing time????

Added increased traffic on a very busy main road gives more cause for car accidents and that's not counting blind spots when pulling off the drive to pull onto the main road.

Victoria road is a reasonably straight road with slight bend towards the old police station and cars zoom up with out a care.

Having said all the above Palm Bistro is a nice Café. But we would not think so if it had a Licence for alcohol and all its problems that come with it.

We wish to make a representation concerning the application of a Premises Licence for Palms Bistro (previously 'the Flying Sausage') 96/98 Victoria Road, Kirkby-in-Ashfield, Notts NG17 8AS.

It is understood that conditions have been laid out in relation to this application which refers to the following: Prevention of Crime & Disorder, Prevention of Public Nuisance, Promotion of Public Safety and Protection of Children from Harm.

Despite this, as residents it is felt that the sale of alcohol on these premises increases all aspects of public nuisance through noise and anti-social behaviour in the immediate vicinity of the Café. The Café is very much part of a row of residential properties not separated by other commercial properties increasing the impact. The residents need to be reassured that all the conditions are strictly followed.

There is concern regarding the notice in local press stating the supply of alcohol Monday to Sunday 6:00 - 23:00. This is clearly beyond the current opening hours as agreed through appeal to planning in 2017. That appeal gave a limited time of extended hours to reassess the impact on residents and also stipulated different times on Sundays and the use of outdoor space. It is understood that current planning permissions override licencing applications re opening times etc which come under planning control and agreements are needed. In light of this representation it of concern that the public notice does not reflect this and is of concern to us as residents in its impacts as previously stated.

It has been clarified that the applicant seeks: Sale of Alcohol (consumed solely on the premises) Midday – 10 pm daily (Mon – Sun), and until 11.30pm on New Year's Eve. Therefore, not in agreement with the current planning consent as we understand it. Any consideration of this application needs to be clear about this situation.

This representation objects to this application for the sale of alcohol in respect of the potential impact on residents from anti- social behaviour and particularly increased noise levels and the increase in the number of people in the vicinity throughout the


week which would affect the well-being of the older residents, working people and those with young families particularly.

If this licence is to include an agreement of provision of regulated entertainment we feel this would potentially cause further increase to noise in this residential area and serious consideration should be made of this along side the issues relating to increased sale of alcohol.

We have lived here and been supportive of all residents for 60 years but felt that we needed to represent our concern for ourselves and other residents who live in very close proximity to the premises applying for the licence.

During this time the premises have always been used as commercial outlet firstly being a newsagent, then a café and recently a Bistro named Palms Bistro 96-98 Victoria Road. Each new venture bringing ever increasing disruptive noise and disturbance to

Our property is owner occupied and is attached to the Bistro. There are occupied flats above Bistro premises. The flats and the bistro are rented. The owners of the commercial premises use the Bistro on a lock up and leave and do not reside in the vicinity.

The purpose of this letter is to oppose the recent application for the premises to hold a liquor licence. At present patrons who dine in the in the premises are allowed to bring in their own alcohol. We wish to complain about noise and disturbance which is evident during current opening hours, and after closing hours whilst clearing up is being undertaken. This can be heard in my property both day and very late evening and is becoming wearing and disruptive to our lives.

Any further increase to the opening hours would be intolerable. There has been no prior consultation of the proposed extended hours and application for a liquor licence by the owners of the Bistro. The application submitted is for Monday to Sunday 6am till 11pm. Therefore we will have no respite should the application be granted.

During this summer with more regularity, larger parties have been held including wedding receptions ,theme nights and curry nights where alcohol was consumed both inside and outside on the wooden terrace at the front of the premises immediately next to our front sitting room and below our main bedroom. People gather on the terrace to

to our front sitting room and below our main bedroom. People gather on the terrace to talk drink smoke and sit outside. We have endured singing, music, as well as bagpipes being played and barking dogs of owners attending the functions.

This prevents us from opening windows in my home because of the noise and disruption. We are unintentionally involved with all these parties and celebrations. We fear this will only increase and create further problems if a liquor licence is granted.

Both my wife and I work, I as a postman and she in the local newsagents, which requires us both to have early morning starts 6 days a week, getting up at 4.15am leaving home before 5am. In contrast we retire to bed early evening. If the opportunity arises we take a short nap after work.

However sleeping at any time is becoming most difficult as it is not only the noises from pots and kitchen equipment being put away but the noise from patrons in and outside the premises when they leave the premises during very late evenings. Should the extended hours with alcohol be extended then disruption could be until nearer midnight.

This is now being to affect our health and welfare as sleep deprivation is increasing as is the frustration. The thought of a liquor licence being granted so close to residential properties for over 10 hours daily seems a totally unacceptable situation.

Over the past 12 months I have had to resort to and invested in the fitting of sound proofing to the inner walls within my home particularly my front bedroom and ground floor rooms. This has involved the fitting of said sound proofing, re-plastering and decoration, adding even more daily disruption to our lives whilst the work was undertaken and for me an enforced substantial financial outlay. Despite our efforts we still continue to have disruptive noise.

We have been very tolerant of our situation so far as we were assured by the owners of the Bistro that they would not be applying for a liquor licence. We cannot see any justifiable reason to move home in order to gain rest and sleep whilst commercial enterprise flourishes without consequence or concern of local residents. I seek to be considered and valued not dismissed.

I respectfully request you to consider this application and refuse to grant it.

We have to live with the consequences of your decisions, whilst the enterprise fails to acknowledge or take account of neighbours and noise their business creates and impacts on a daily basis.
