5. BACKGROUND

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 came in to force in September 2005.
- 5.2 It passed the powers to the Local Authority to Licence premises for the sale of alcohol to the public
- 5.3 The licensing objectives are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - · Public safety:
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.
- 5.4 Each objective is of equal importance. There are no other statutory licensing objectives, so that the promotion of the four objectives is a paramount consideration at all times.
- 5.5 However, the legislation also supports a number of other key aims and purposes. These are vitally important and should be principal aims for everyone involved in licensing work.
- 5.6. Section 18 of the 2003 Act, allows interested persons, and responsible authorities, to make representations in favour or against the grant of a premises licence.

- 5.7 Should valid representations be received a public hearing must be held within 20 working days following the end of the representation period.
- 5.8 On the 11 March 2016, an application was received for a new Premises Licence for Porterhouse by Barlows, 174 Forest Road, Kirkby-In-Ashfield, Nottinghamshire. NG17 9JB. The application is attached within the hearing file.
- 5.9 During the 28 day representation period the Licensing Team received 3 valid representations against the grant of the Licence from residents of Forest Road, Kirkby-In-Ashfield, contained in the file attached.
- 5.10 A representation has been received from the Police with conditions attached, conditions agreed by Mr S Barlow. No other representations received from other Responsible Authorities.
- 5.11 Members must make an unbiased decision on the grant or refusal of a Premises Licence on the evidence heard at the hearing. Members must also take in to account the Home Office s182 Guidance and the Councils Licensing Policy.
